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### 1. ARRIVAL

Depending on your arrival day and time, it might be a couple of days before we actually meet you at the school for your first lesson.

But rest assured, you are not on your own. If you need anything please call the Oxford International 24 hour Emergency number on +44(0)7775 487 550.

Upon arrival at school you will be given a copy of our student handbook. This is available to download online and we encourage all students to read this carefully before arrival. Even if you are taking a programme with afternoon lessons, please arrive at school at 9am on your first day.

Students will start their course on a Monday (except for Bank Holidays) The first day starts at 9am on arrival at the school, each student will be asked to complete an Oxford International registration form and all students to take a level placement test. The School Principal will then meet the new students, before they have an induction with the School Administrator, which includes an introduction to the school and to key staff members, as well as discussing life in the UK and the social programme on offer. After lunch, students who have booked a Full Day or Afternoon course will have the option of classes in the afternoon, and all students are invited to join the Social Programme Organiser on a walking tour of the city. All students who have booked a morning course will begin lessons on the second day.

Please note our reception and school will open at 8.45 am



### 2. GETTING TO BRIGHTON

**Travelling from London Victoria Train Station**: Take any train to Brighton from London Victoria Station – these usually depart from platform 18 or 19, but check the boards for details. During peak times there are usually at least four trains per hour which take approximately 50 minutes. The standard one way fare to Brighton is £13.50.

**Travelling from London Victoria Coach Station:** Coaches to Brighton run every hour, journey time is approximately 2 hours and tickets cost from £7.

Brighton is easily accessible from all London airports by train or coach.

**Travelling from Gatwick**: Trains run directly from Gatwick airport to Brighton station. During peak times there are usually four trains per hour. The standard one way fare is £8 and journey time is 30 - 40 minutes.

**Travelling from Heathrow**: The easiest way to get to Brighton is by coach. Take the National Express Coach from the main coach station to Brighton. Travel time is approximately one and half hours and the standard one way far fare is £23.

Alternatively take the tube to Victoria Station and follow the guidelines above.

**Travelling from Stansted**: Coaches to Brighton run every hour via Gatwick airport and take approximately 4 hours. The standard one way fare is £32.

Alternatively trains to London Liverpool Street Station leave Stansted every 20 minutes during peak time. From here, take the tube to Victoria Station and following the directions above. Price is approximately £35.

**Travelling from Luton**: Take the Thameslink train from Luton airport to London Bridge train station, from where you can take trains directly to Brighton. Travel time is approximately 4 hours and should cost in the region of £40 one way.

Alternatively take a coach to Victoria train station in London from where you can take either direct trains or coaches to Brighton using the instructions above.

\* There's a standard single journey fare of £2.50 throughout the Brighton and Hove conurbation, stretching from Shoreham in the west to Falmer and Saltdean in the east, but with £2 fares available for short hops or in the central area of the city.
