Job purpose

To teach English to groups of junior and adult students following a syllabus and using materials provided by the school.

Main duties and responsibilities

Teaching

- Prepare lessons and adapt existing materials to suit students' needs and abilities.
- Deliver lessons with the aim of achieving the objectives of the syllabus and to the standards set out by the Academic Management Team
- Effectively manage (with the support of the Academic Management Team) students and their behaviour
- Encourage student participation through a positive and enthusiastic attitude about activities in which they are involved
- Agree to be observed by a member of the Academic Management team.
- Dress appropriately to the role at all times

Administrative

- Attend weekly staff meetings (usually during lunch break)
- Keep an accurate record of student attendance and lateness and alert the Academic Management Team to any absences where required
- Complete a weekly scheme of work at the start of each week, and record of work for what has been taught the previous week
- Complete student reports at the end of their course

Other

- Attend a staff induction prior to the start of the contract
- Complete online welfare and safeguarding training
- Be a positive and professional role model for the students, representative of the core values of Oxford International Education Group
- Opportunities for CPD will be provided by the school (workshops and training). However, teachers are expected to take an interest in and responsibility for their own CPD as an EFL teacher, with the support of the Academic Management team
